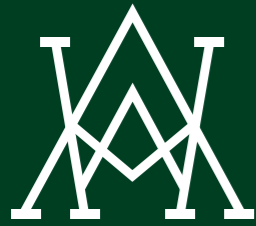

Results

In 2020, 41% of Akeley Wood pupils achieved grades 9-7 at GCSE, with 88% of grades at 5+ and 98% at 4+. This compares to national averages of 27.5%, 61.5% and 78.8% respectively.

In the same year, 58% of Akeley A-Level students were awarded A*-B grades with 83% achieving A*-C.

Leavers' destinations

All of Akeley's leavers at A-Level who applied for University advanced to that level, including to Russell Group universities. Support is also given to students exploring alternative pathways, including coveted training places with international employers, the military etc.

Sport and the Arts

All of the traditional team sports such as football and rugby are played at Akeley, plus fencing, wakeboarding, snowboarding, skiing, martial arts and equestrian.

Music, Art and Drama are offered to A-Level plus Music Technology and Media and Film Studies. Success in these areas has been demonstrated by Akeley students winning in a variety of categories at the Moving Images Awards four years in a row.

Results

In 2020, 68.1% of NBH Hampstead and 65.4% of NBH Canonbury students achieved a grade 7 or above at GCSE with 23.1% and 23.9% respectively achieving the highest grade 9. This included 46% of Biology and 43% of both Chemistry and Physics results awarded a grade 9 at NBH Hampstead. Similar success was seen at the NBH Canonbury site, where 100% of students studying Physics and Computer Science achieved grade 7 or above and 100% achieved grade 7 or above in Art.

At A-Level, 84% of North Bridge House students achieved a B or above, including 68% of students who achieved the top A and A* grades. Particular success was seen in Chemistry, Maths, Further Maths and Art where 100% of students achieved these top grades, highlighting the school's strength in both academic and creative fields.

Leavers' destinations

Approximately 95% of graduating students advanced to university with typical destinations including the University of Oxford and other top Russell Group destinations, such as Bristol, Cardiff and Edinburgh.

Sport and the Arts

Students from both Senior Hampstead and Senior Canonbury have access to excellent sporting facilities. These include the multi-purpose sports hall on-site at Hampstead while students at Canonbury frequent the best North London facilities for outdoor adventure and water sports including climbing, mountain biking and kayaking.

Other sports covered include athletics, badminton, basketball, benchball, cricket, dance, dodgeball, football, gymnastics, handball, indoor climbing, netball, rounders, rugby, squash, table tennis, tennis and volleyball. Nearly all these sports are available as part of the broad GCSE curriculum, with core sport still taking place for students not taking PE as a GCSE option.

Away from the sporting field, Music, Art and Drama are all taught to a high standard with 86% of students gaining a grade 7 or above in art at GCSE.

Results

Quinton House has a history of consistently achieving excellent GCSE results. In 2020, 100% of all results were at grade 4+, compared to a national average of 78.8%. Quinton House pupils also continue to excel beyond the national average at the highest levels, with 40.5% of all results at grade 7+ against 27.5% nationally.

Quinton House School and its students are regularly shortlisted for ISA awards. Recent successes include a student finalist at the Young Musician's Awards in 2020 and the 'Excellence & Innovation in Partnerships' category in recognition of the school's global partnerships.

Leavers' destinations

The Quinton House School Sixth Form relaunched in September 2020 with the unveiling of brand new, state-of-the-art Sixth Form facilities. When A level courses were previously offered at the school, students gained places at the most competitive Russell Group universities, including the University of Oxford and University of Cambridge.

Sport and the Arts

From Year 3 onwards, Games is added to the curriculum and the school's focus sports are rugby, football and cricket (for boys), netball, hockey and rounders (for girls). The school plays regular fixtures and tournaments with other schools in these sports. Additional fixtures and competitive opportunities with other schools include athletics, cross-country and swimming.

There is a vast array of music-based activities in both the Preparatory and Senior schools, with individual and small group peripatetic lessons offered in piano, strings, woodwind, brass, voice and percussion instruments. Quinton House has an extensive range of extra-curricular music ensembles to extend musical development and to experience practising and performing as a group. From Prep Quinton Singers to the Senior orchestra, students are encouraged to get involved and enjoy themselves.

Results

Southbank International School is London's leading IB World School. In 2020, Southbank pupils achieved 37 points out of 45 on the International Baccalaureate Diploma. This compares to a global average of 30 points for those studying for the award.

One student achieved a perfect score of 45, two students scored 44 and 19% of all students scored above 40. Only 0.2% of all students worldwide scored full marks in 2020 and just 0.6% achieved a score of 44. Southbank students also achieved a 100% pass rate, far more than the global average of 79%.

The latest ISI results also showed the school to be at the Outstanding level.

Leavers' destinations

The excellent results achieved by Southbank pupils meant that, in 2020, 95% of students gained access to their first-choice university and 60% of those going to university in the UK were accepted into Russell Group institutions.

As such, Southbank leavers have gone on to study at many top universities in the UK including the University of Oxford, the University of Cambridge and other top Russell Group destinations, such as Imperial College London, the London School of Economics and Political Science, University College London and King's College London, as well as University of the Arts London.

Results

In 2020, 53.3% of St Clare's students achieved a grade 7 or above at GCSE, with 89.8% of grades at grade 5 or above and 97.1% at grade 4 or above. This compares to UK national averages of 27.5%, 61.5% and 78.8% respectively.

At A-Level, 76.3% of students achieved the top A and A* grades, with 100% of students achieving a B or better. This compares to UK national averages of 37% and 67% respectively.

Leavers' destinations

100% of graduating students advanced to university, including many Russell Group destinations, to read competitive subjects such as Medical Sciences, Mathematics, Veterinary Medicine, Architecture and Computer Sciences & AI.

Sport and the Arts

Students at St Clare's enjoy playing and studying many sports such as athletics, basketball, football, hockey, netball, rugby, tennis and cross country.

In 2020, Downsend School began its flagship 3-year GCSE programme, welcoming the first group of Year 9s, with Years 10 and 11 to follow in 2021 and 2022. The main school will cover the 6-16 age range once the GCSE rollout is completed. The school also boasts three Little Downsend's that cover the 2-6 age range.

ISI results

The school was rated 'good' for all metrics in its latest ISI inspection.

Sport and the Arts

Downsend pupils play a full range of sports as part of the curriculum and in after school clubs. The school is particularly strong in cricket (England Cricketer Dom Sibley is a notable alumnus) and in swimming, with a pool on site. Downsend was also a finalist in the Independent School of the Year Awards in 2019 in the Sporting Achievement category.

In early 2021, a £5 million, state-of-the-art Creative Arts Centre will launch, adding to the already high-level and broad offerings in this area. Music varies from classical to rock, including the annual Downsend Rocks concert.

Catering

Our catering team serve our pupils nutritionally balanced meals every lunchtime, offering meat, fish and vegetarian options, a salad bar and other healthy alternatives. The team uses locally sourced ingredients wherever possible and aim to deliver outstanding quality, every day.

Results

In 2020, 100% of Long Close pupils achieved Grade 5 in their English and Maths GCSEs. 100% of pupils achieved Grade 7 and above in all Triple Science papers (national average 53%) and 86% of pupils achieved Grade 6 or above in all GCSE papers.

The school was also ranked 'outstanding in all areas' in its last full inspection conducted by the ISI and is ranked 44th in the Sunday Times' Parent Power league table.

Leavers' destinations

Year 6 students have recently secured scholarships to The Abbey School, Hampton School, Wellington College and Millfield School. Year 11 leavers are accepted into A level courses at local grammar schools and selective independent schools.

Sport

The school has a team of specialist sports teachers who work with all pupils – from Nursery school through to Senior. Pupils enjoy regular PE, games and swimming lessons as part of the weekly timetable. Along the way, they also learn to play sports such as rugby, football, cricket, hockey, netball, gymnastics, athletics and rounders.

Long Close School students have access to two excellent astro-turf pitches, cricket nets, a bowling machine and a long-jump pit within the school grounds. Parkland surrounding the school is also used for games such as rugby and rounders.



Pupils have represented Berkshire Cricket at Under 11 level while the school also has links to Slough Hockey Club for girls' hockey.

The Arts

The School's Head of Music leads classroom lessons from KS1 to GCSE where students explore various musical concepts and skills through a mixture of practical and written work. A dedicated team of peripatetic staff also support students' musical development and deliver more than 80 instrumental lessons every week. Throughout the year, pupils are given the opportunity to showcase their performance skills in lessons, assemblies and concerts.

Each term, students can be entered for ABRSM Music exams: a valuable qualification which, when they reach Grade 5, can be used as UCAS points on university applications.

Dance and LAMDA extra-curricular clubs are run weekly by external specialist staff, and these students are often involved in the Music led events.

Catering

The school's catering team run a number of international themed days during the year while a variety of foods and cuisines, including Indian, are available more regularly.

Results

At Meoncross School in 2020, 98.5% of all GCSE grades awarded were at 4 or above, compared to the national average of 78.8%. This included 55.8% of grades at 7+ and 31.4% of grades at 8 or 9.

In Biology and Chemistry, 50% of students achieved grade 9 with 38% achieving grade 9 in Physics. Similarly, in History and Spanish, 36% and 29% achieved grade 9 respectively, illustrating the breadth of the Meoncross curriculum.

Leavers' destinations

The vast majority of students leaving Meoncross at the end of Year 11 go on to study A Levels at some of the region's most respected further education colleges. Many continue to top UK universities including those in the Russell Group, Oxford and Cambridge.
